Improving Recreation

Marathon City is finalizing plans for a new and expanded park in the Village. The new park will include a new 4 diamond baseball / softball complex, two outdoor basketball courts, two public pavilions, a challenge course playground and supporting infrastructure.

The park will replace the current Veteran's Park and will be the new home of the Annual Marathon Fun Days.

The Need

The Current Veteran's Park Facility is undersized for the needs of the community. At only 4.2 acres, the park has 1 regulation softball field, no playground, limited parking and no opportunity for expansion. Additionally, Veteran's Park is located between two of the highest traffic streets in the Village. The annual Marathon Fun Days requires street closures and detours around the park area.

Nearly 500 area children ranging from tee ball to high school Varsity Softball utilize the current facilities. Over 550 games and practices occur annually at Veteran's Park.

The new facility would provide increased access for practice, games and tournaments. The 14.5 acre site provides room for Fun Days expansion and increased flexibility for event planners. The new location moves the park complex away from busy streets separating spectators and participants from traffic issues.


COMMUNITY CAPITAL CAMPAIGN
