At the General Election to be held on November 8, 2022 in the Village of Marathon City, the polling place for Wards 1, 2 & 3 is the Municipal Building, 311 Walnut Street. The polling place hours are 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. This polling place is accessible to elderly and disabled voters. Notice of Meeting of the Local and Municipal Board of Canvassers.

At the close of voting on Election Day, pursuant to the provisions of Wis. Stat. § 19.84, the Election Inspectors will convene as a joint meeting of the Local Board of Canvassers and the Municipal Board of Canvassers for the purpose of conducting the local and municipal canvasses pursuant to Wis. Stat. §§7.51 and 7.53(1). This meeting will be open to the public pursuant to Wis. Stat. §§ 19.81-89.

Notice to electors: The ballot may be invalid unless initialed by two (2) election inspectors. If cast as an absentee ballot, the ballot must bear the initials of the municipal or deputy clerk. Important: use a medium point black pen or the marking pen provided. Do not use red ink!! If an elector spoils a ballot, they shall return it to the election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one elector. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the elector in marking their vote may be taken into the booth and copied, but the sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone as to reveal how the ballot is marked. After casting their vote, the elector shall leave the voting booth, properly deposit the ballot and promptly leave the polling place.

An elector may select an individual to assist in casting their vote if the elector declares to the presiding official that they are unable to read, has difficulty reading, writing or understanding English or that due to disability is unable to cast their ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the elector's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer/agent of a labor organization which represents the elector. To vote for the candidate of your choice, completely fill in the oval to the **LEFT** of the candidate's name. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, write the person's name on the line provided and completely fill in the oval to the **LEFT** of the line.

Notice to voters: If you are voting on Election Day, your ballot must be initialed by two election inspectors. If you are voting absentee, your ballot must be initialed by the municipal clerk or deputy clerk. Your ballot may not be counted without initials (see end of ballot for initials).
